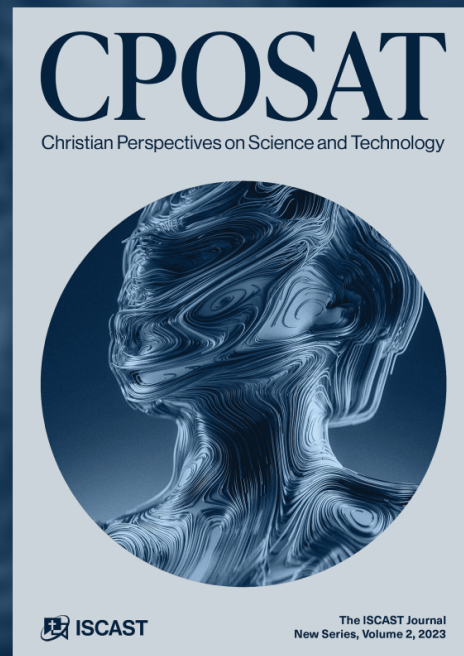

# Ethics and Malpractice Statement



*Christian Perspectives on Science and Technology (CPOSAT)* is the peer reviewed, open access journal of ISCAST. Articles, book reviews, and opinion & response pieces are published once they become available (after peer review, in the case of articles, and revision for all submitted materials), through the year. At the close of each annual volume, the articles, book reviews, and opinion & response pieces are collected in a single PDF made available at no cost on the journal's website ([journal.iscast.org](http://journal.iscast.org)), as well as published in printed format (which can be purchased from ISCAST's main website, [iscast.org](http://iscast.org)). Occasionally, the journal hosts special thematic editions.

The following ethics and malpractice statements for *CPOSAT* are based on COPE's Best Practice Guidelines for Journal Editors ([publicationethics.org](http://publicationethics.org) and [doi.org/10.24318/cope.2019.1.12](https://doi.org/10.24318/cope.2019.1.12)), adjusted to *CPOSAT*'s specifics.

## Publication

The editors of the journal are responsible for deciding which articles, book reviews, and opinion & response pieces submitted to the journal will be published. The decision will be based on the submitted material's relevance to ISCAST's vision, mission, and values ([iscast.org/about](http://iscast.org/about)), as well as its contribution to the field, clarity, and relevance to the journal's scope ([journal.iscast.org/about](http://journal.iscast.org/about)). The editors will evaluate the manuscripts based on their scholarly merit, without regard to the authors' race, gender, age, religious belief, ethnicity, citizenship, or political views. Editorial decisions are guided by the policies of the journal's editorial board, the advice of expert peer reviewers, and subject to applicable legal requirements regarding libel, copyright infringement, and plagiarism. All authors must sign a publication agreement with ISCAST, *CPOSAT*'s publisher.

## Confidentiality

The editors and any editorial staff will not disclose any information about a submitted manuscript to anyone other than the corresponding author, reviewers, potential reviewers, other editorial advisers, and the publisher.

## Disclosure and Conflicts of Interest

Unpublished materials disclosed in a submitted article, book review, or opinion & response paper will not be used by the editors, the reviewers, or the members of the editorial board for their own research purposes without the author's written consent.

The editors will recuse themselves from considering manuscripts in which they have conflicts of interest resulting from competitive, collaborative, or other connections with any of the authors, and will ask another member of the editorial board to handle the manuscript. The same principle applies to potential peer reviewers contacted by the editors.

All authors should disclose any financial or other substantive conflict of interest that might influence their contribution. To that end, they will be asked to confirm a statement that there are no conflicts of interest to report, before the publication of their respective works. All sources of financial support for the project should be acknowledged explicitly.

## Submission Exclusivity

All authors confirm in writing at the time of submission to *CPOSAT* that their manuscript is not concurrently being submitted or under review by another journal.

## Peer Review

*CPOSAT* provides for double blind peer review; both the identity of the author and the reviewers remain undisclosed. Reviewers will be selected by the editors based on their scholarly expertise relevant to the manuscript's theme and argument. The reviewers are provided with a form that addresses such matters as suitability and contribution, style and methodology, appropriate references, title and presentation, etc.

Reviewers should endeavour to be objective in their assessment and should advise the editors of any substantial similarity or overlap between the manuscript being assessed and any other published materials known to them. Reviewers' comments should be clearly expressed and supported by data or arguments. Personal criticism of the author(s) is not appropriate.

## Originality and Plagiarism

As stated in the guidelines for authors ([journal.iscast.org/submit-an-article](http://journal.iscast.org/submit-an-article); [journal.iscast.org/submit-a-book-review](http://journal.iscast.org/submit-a-book-review)), authors must submit an original work that has not been published previously and that in no way violates any existing copyright.

Before being accepted for publication, authors must sign a Publication Agreement that agrees to the following conditions: "The article [book review, opinion & response piece] is an original work and was not published previously"; "The article does not violate any existing copyright."

Authors will submit only entirely original works and will appropriately cite or quote the works of others, refraining from misrepresenting the ideas and the words of other authors. Any submitted materials found to have engaged in plagiarism will be rejected.

## Use of Artificial Intelligence

*CPOSAT* welcomes the use of Generative Artificial Intelligence (AI) tools, such as large language models (LLMs) or multimodal models, for the purposes of enhancing research, creation of imagery, and supporting authors to express content in English as a non-native language. Nevertheless, given the risks associated with AI use—spanning from inaccuracy and bias, lack of attribution, confidentiality and intellectual property infringements, and unintended uses—authors are responsible for ensuring the originality, validity, scholarly rigour, and integrity of the content of their submissions. Authors must clearly acknowledge within their work any use of Generative AI tools through a statement which includes: the full name of the tool used (with version number), how it was used, and the reason for use. Statements to that effect should feature either in the methodological outline or in acknowledgments.

## Reuse of Materials Published in *CPOSAT*

Authors who wish to republish, post, or substantially alter an article, book review, or opinion & response paper, either in print or in digital media, can do so in accordance with *CPOSAT*'s licensing terms under copyright law. Specifically, articles, book reviews, and opinion & response pieces can be reused under the CC BY-NC-SA licence, which permits reuse for non-commercial purposes, provided that proper attribution is given to the original publication in *CPOSAT*. This also applies to third parties. Any reuse of materials published in *CPOSAT* for commercial purposes requires written permission from the journal's editorial office.
